

## Works Notice: Major Hornbrook Road, Mt Pleasant, Reservoir repairs

**What:** Earthquake repairs to the Mt Pleasant 2-2 reservoir.

**Where:** 87 Major Hornbrook Road, near Billys Track.

**When:** Work will begin from Monday 5 August 2013 and is expected to be completed in late 2013. The completion date is dependent on results of further investigation work.

**Traffic impact:** There will be increased traffic movements on Major Hornbrook Road by the entrance to the reservoir.

### What we are doing:

There are two reservoirs at the Mount Pleasant 2 site positioned either side of Major Hornbrook Road. This project relates to Reservoir 2-2 on the eastern side of the road. Emergency repairs to this reservoir were undertaken in August to September 2011 but areas of water leakage have since developed. It is likely this is from further aftershocks or areas of previously undetected damage.

It has not been possible to carry out full internal damage investigations of the reservoir tank since the leakage has been noted. We will carry out detailed investigations as part of this work which will require the tank to be emptied. Any cracks will be fixed with epoxy or grout. If the damage found is more extensive than expected work may take longer.

## How our work could impact you, general impact:


- There will be increased noise, dust and vibration levels associated with this work, and the use of trucks and other machinery will be necessary.
- Works will take place between 7.00am and 6.00pm, Monday to Friday, with Saturday work if required.
- Works will have no planned impact on current power, telecommunication, wastewater, water or gas services. However, the network is still fragile so please be prepared in case there is an unexpected service cut off.
- Safety is our number one priority. Safety is your responsibility too. Stay clear and stay alert - keep children and pets at a safe distance from the work site.
- All works are subject to favourable weather and on-site construction conditions.
